

2007 Thomson-Delmar Research Awards

The Council of Academic Programs is proud to announce the availability of two awards given for the conduct of student research. These awards are supported jointly by Thomson Delmar Learning and the CAPCSD.

The Thomson Delmar Learning — CAPCSD Scholarship Award for Master's or AuD Research

This award will be given to a student whose research project, completed during the Master's or Au.D. program, is deemed most worthy of recognition.

The Thomson Delmar Learning — CAPCSD Scholarship Award for Ph.D. Research

This award will be given to a student whose research project, completed during the Ph.D. program, is deemed most worthy of recognition.

Each award consists of

- \$3000 honorarium
- Complementary registration to the 2007 meeting of CAPCSD at the Wyndham Palm Spring Hotel, Palm Springs CA, April 11-14, 2007
- \$500 travel support
- Hotel and meal expenses during the conference

Applications should contain (in Word or RTF format)

- A statement from the applicant providing (a) a brief overview of the research project, (b) a description of the student's motivation to carry out the research project (for Master's or Au.D. students) or the motivation for the student to pursue a Ph.D. degree (for Ph.D. students), and (c) a brief description of the applicant's short- and long-term career plans.
- A detailed description of the research project including (a) a summary of the background literature which places the student's work into the appropriate research context, (b) an outline of the hypotheses tested, (c) a description of the methodology utilized, (d) a summary of the results and (e) an interpretation of the results in light of the questions addressed. This project description may be no more than 15 pages in length (doubled-spaced, 12-pt font. ½ inch margins) with up to 5 additional pages of tables and/or graphs. Students should not submit copies of the original thesis or dissertation.

Applications should be sent electronically to Robert A. Fox, Council VP for Research and Academic Affairs (fox.2@osu.edu) by **Monday, January 29, 2007**. There may be more than one applicant for each award from a single institution.

Reviews will be conducted by experts in the content areas addressed in the proposals, under the direction of the Council VP for Research and Academic Development. Awardees will be announced in late February or early March.

Awardees will be introduced to the Council during the spring meeting, and each awardee

will prepare a poster presentation and be available to discuss his/her work with conference attendees.
