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STATUS REPORT

BOARD MEMBERS ATTEND IOM'S GLOBAL FORUM ON INNOVATION IN HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

In late November, BOD members, Melody Harrison, Sarah Ginsberg, Jennifer Taylor, and I attended the Institute of Medicine's Global Forum on Innovation in Health Professional Education. This Forum, which drew individuals from around the world, was focused on issues related to interprofessional education (i.e., "when two or more professions learn from and about each other to improve collaboration and the quality of care"). The BOD has recognized the importance of interprofessional education and the growing need for members to understand and be informed about this type of educational model. As such, the Council is now a member of the IOM's Global Forum so that it has a voice at the national level in educational offerings and, potentially, policy decisions regarding interprofessional education. Not surprisingly, quite a few of our member programs already are actively involved in interprofessional education. Kenn and Patty Prelock will be reviewing these programs and discussing interprofessional education at our April conference.

SEARCH FOR NEW ASSOCIATION MANAGEMENT COMPANY UPDATE

As you know, the BOD has been in the process of searching for an Association Management Company (AMC) because Frances Laven, who has been our Executive Director for the last 25 years, will be retiring in June, 2013. As I write this update, the BOD is fresh from its return from a long Board meeting this past weekend that included interviews with our top three candidate AMCs. Across two days, we interviewed representatives from these three companies. The interviews were both enlightening and intensive. After a great deal of discussion, we narrowed the field to two of the

companies and called references for each. We now will be calling one of the AMCs later this week to ask a few additional questions and, barring any unforeseen surprises, we believe we will be entering into negotiations with that company to become our next association management company.
